- (25) These arrangements willddress Members' needs to travel intrastate in order to be informed on issues which affect not only their constituents, but the State whole. The vised accommodation allowance places previous arrangements that limit members to travel within their own electorate and electorate immediately adjacent thereto.
- (26) The Tribunal considers the new arrangements will better serve the Members and the community.
