Framework, states and territories are responsible for the authorisation of restrictive practices used by registered NDIS providers and NDIS Behaviour Support Practitioners.

support to the sector in implementing the Policy.

NDIS Quality and Safeguards Commission

From 1 December 2020, the NDIS Quality and Safeguards Commission (NDIS Commission) commenced regulating registered NDIS providers in WA. The NDIS Commission is responsible for:

regulatory oversight of the use of regulated restrictive practices

registration of NDIS providers

determination of Behaviour Support Practitioner suitability against the NDIS Commission Positive Behaviour Support Capability Framework (2019)

quality audits of

providing information to registered NDIS providers, state-funded disability service providers and other participants in the authorisation of restrictive practice process to facilitate engagement and compliance with the Policy
